High-Quality Education and Childcare

Kobe is leading the way in early childhood care. With no waitlisted children, the city is now focused on raising the

bar for quality in preschools, kindergartens, and certified child centers—giving every child the best start in life.

Exceptional After-School Programs



All elementary school children can access afterschool programs, ensuring support for families who need it.

Family-Friendly Workspaces

City-run co-working spaces are available for remote workers and those on parental leave. These facilities include free temporary childcare and kids' play areas—and are open to all parents.





Parenting is Tough— But You're Not Alone!

Postpartum Care Facilities (35 locations)



For one year after childbirth, midwives are available for parenting consultations. Nutritious meals are also provided.

Kodomotto Hiroba (Children's Centers)



Available for children aged 0 to 18 and their guardians. Staff with childcare experience are always on–site and available for consultations.

Kobecco Welcome Care Packages

Childcare supplies are delivered to your home once a month, up to 10 times. Childcare consultations are also available during care package delivery visits.

Commuter Pass Subsidy for Senior High School Students

Available to senior high school students living in Kobe City. Full subsidy for commuting within the city, and half subsidy for commuting outside the city.



Community Study Rooms (Starting July 2025)

Free study spaces for junior and senior high school students are available at 39 locations across the city. Advance registration is required.

Hyogo Canal
