## Passions and Strengths Help Create a Sustainable Future

Kobe is home to many unique organizations working toward Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), including efforts in food waste reduction, environmental conservation, employment support for people with disabilities, education, and partnerships. Here are four organizations that received the “Kobe SDGs Award”, and their activities:

### Köln Bakery: “Tsunagu Bread”



Reduces food waste by packaging and selling unsold bread from the previous day. Köln also distributes “Ethical Coins” to both customers and welfare facilities, contributing to social support.



### Peace&Nature: Training Green Leaders



This program brings together multinational youth to experience SDGs firsthand while tackling local issues such as aging populations and neglected bamboo forests. It fosters entrepreneurial spirit through hands-on engagement.



### Mikage Club: Making and Selling Paper



Leveraging the strengths of individuals with disabilities, the Mikage Club creates handmade paper from recycled sake cartons, connecting the sake culture of Mikage with local welfare initiatives.



### Tamaichi Aquarium: Conservation Efforts Along the Akashi River



Students from Tamatsu Daiichi Elementary School and local supporters conduct weekly surveys of aquatic life in the Akashi River and remove invasive species. During summer break, students and supporters study over 90 species and compile their findings into a field guide.

### 2. Kobe Recycled Phosphorus Project



This initiative efficiently recovers phosphorus from wastewater and uses it to create fertilizer called “Kobe Harvest.”

Vegetables grown with this fertilizer are sold in supermarkets

and produce shops as

“BE KOBE Agricultural Products.”



### 3. “My True Self” Project



Kobe supports everyone in living authentically. Through open meetings, people can explore various life choices—like work styles, marriage, and childbirth—in a supportive and inclusive environment.



## FY2024 Financial Report

In fiscal year 2024, Kobe City actively promoted SDGs-based initiatives, while working to build a warm and welcoming community where every citizen can live happily.



### Revenue: ¥945.6 billion

City tax revenue increased by approximately ¥3.3billion due to strong corporate performance, particularly in corporate municipal and fixed asset taxes. Additionally, administrative and financial reforms led to a surplus of about ¥1.4 billion.

### Expenditures: ¥930.7 billion

Kobe City responded to the declining birthrate and aging population by expanding transportation support for students and seniors. The city also invested in disaster countermeasures, school upgrades, internationalization of Kobe Airport, and urban redevelopment in Sannomiya to improve residents' daily life and enhance the city's appeal.

### Major Initiatives in FY2024:

#### 1. Protecting Citizens' Lives and Safety — ¥50.5 billion



- Implemented protections against storm surges, tsunamis, and flooding
- Addressed increasingly frequent high temperatures
- Noto Peninsula earthquake aid and relief

#### 2. People-Focused City Development — ¥51.3 billion

#### 3. Building a Sustainable Kobe — ¥31.3 billion
