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What We Can Do for the Future of Our City Buses



City-run buses are facing difficulties in continuing service due to declining ridership, financial shortages, and a lack of drivers. If everyone uses Kobe City's buses a little more, we can help keep the service running.



Special Discount Offers:

1. Eco Family Discount:

Up to two children (per accompanying adult) of elementary school age or younger can ride for free. To get this discount, tell the driver "Eco Family desu" when disembarking.

2. Downtown Area IC Card Discount:

If you ride a City bus using an IC card within the Sannomiya, Motomachi, Kyoryuchi, and Kitano areas, the bus fare becomes 120 yen per ride (regular fare is 230 yen).

3. Bus Transfer with IC Cards:

When you pay with an IC card and transfer to another City bus within 30 minutes, the second ride is discounted by up to 230 yen.

4. IC Card Points:

When you use an IC card to ride the City buses or Sanyo buses, you can earn points based on your monthly usage, which in turn can be used to pay your fares in the following month.

Towards a More Disaster-Resilient City

During the Great Hanshin-Awaji Earthquake, many fires broke out and caused extensive damage.

Based on this experience, the Kobe City Fire Department has strengthened its measures against fires that may occur during earthquakes. The national government established an emergency fire response team, known as the "Dragon Hyper Command Unit." One of these units is also stationed in Kobe City.

This response unit is capable of drawing water from distant locations such as the sea, rivers, and dams, and can pump it to locations as far as one kilometer away.

Local Hidden Gem: Minatogawa Tunnel

The Minatogawa Tunnel was built in 1901 to carry river water. Today, it is preserved as a historic civil engineering heritage site.



The tunnel is made of brick and has a beautiful, retro atmosphere. It is usually closed to the public, but tours and concerts are held in the tunnel twice a month.
