Around 30% of Burnable Waste Contains Recyclable Materials

→ Sort as "Container plastics and trays"

→ Take to a community recycling collection point or another designated collection location.

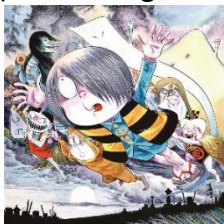
Shigeru Mizuki: Tamashii no Manga Exhibition (Kobe Fashion Museum)
