

Cans/Glass Bottles/PET Plastic Bottles



Collected 1x per week
*Including on holidays
Every Wednesday



Recyclables are sorted at the Nishi Ward Resource Recycling Center to remove stray items, then are taken to the recycling plant.

Applicable items

- Cans, glass bottles, and PET plastic bottles that **contained drinks, food, or seasonings**

Empty cans



* Please dispose of lids and tabs that have been removed from the cans with the non-burnable garbage.

Empty glass bottles



* Returnable glass bottles, beer bottles, and ishobin (1.8L bottles) labeled with the **R** symbol are washed and reused. As much as possible, please return these items to the retailer.

PET plastic bottles

PET

Non-applicable items

- Cans that held paint, etc.
- 18L can, etc.
- Broken bottles, bottles that contained cosmetics, etc.

Non-burnable Garbage

- Plastic containers labeled with the **3** symbol that held detergent, etc.
- **Plastic bottle caps and labels**
- Plastic containers labeled with the **3** symbol that held vegetable or cooking oil, etc.

However, if all remnants cannot be removed,
Burnable Garbage

- Spray cans, gas canisters for portable stoves




Gas Canisters/ Spray Cans

Precautions for disposal

Cans and Glass Bottles

- 1 Completely empty the contents and remove the **cap**.



● If the cap is secured to the bottle and difficult to remove, dispose of the item as is.

- Caps that are left on bottles interfere with the recycling process.

- 2 Rinse out the contents with water.



- If the label cannot be easily removed from the can or glass bottle, dispose of the item as is.
- Enough remnants should be removed for the item to appear clean at a glance.

PET Plastic Bottles

- 1 Completely empty the contents and remove the **cap and label**.



● You do not need to remove the ring below the cap that remains attached to the bottle.

- 2 Rinse out the contents with water.



- Enough remnants should be removed for the item to appear clean at a glance.

Place cans, glass bottles, and plastic bottles together in the designated garbage bag.

Do not mix in other garbage in the bags.

Place items directly into the designated garbage bag without double-bagging, as this interferes with the sorting process.

*Please also make use of recyclable collection programs at stores, etc.



FAQ

Q Why do I have to remove the cap and label on plastic bottles?

A Caps and labels on plastic bottles are classified as **Plastic Containers and Packaging**, and cannot be recycled together with the body of the PET plastic bottle. **Please make sure to remove the cap and label before disposing of the bottle.**
