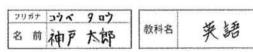


⑤ 中高 英語科問題の解答について (注意)

 - エ、各問いに対して一つずつマークすること。

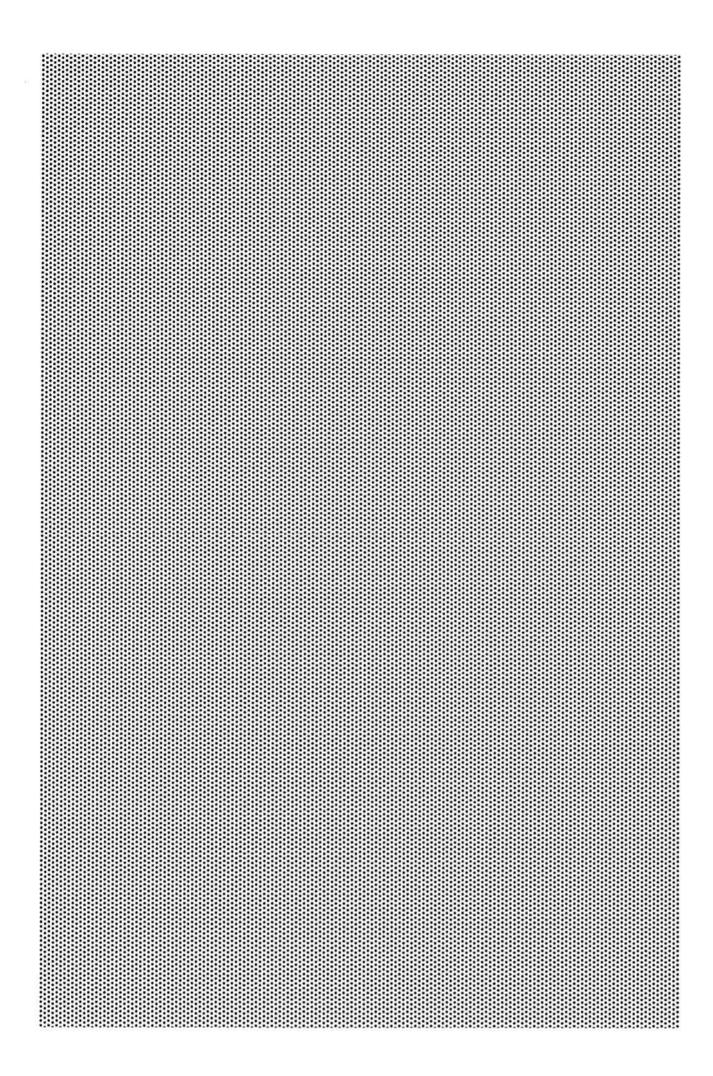
