The One-Time Special Benefit for Livelihood Assistance

In order to reduce the burden of soaring prices in electricity, gas, food, and other essential expenses, we will provide 50,000 yen to low-income households who have been significantly impacted.

Households exempt from resident tax in FY2022

Eligibility: Households that are registered in Kobe City's Basic Resident Register as of September 30, 2022, and in which all members of the household are exempt from paving per capita resident tax for the 2022 fiscal year

How to apply: Confirmation Forms (確認書) are being mailed to eligible households. Complete the form and mail it in the reply envelope. *Must be postmarked by January 31, 2023.

2 Households with sudden changes in finances

Eligibility: Your household does not fall under **①**; your household's income from January to December 2022 decreased due to Covid-19; and all members of your household are estimated to have less income in 1 year than the threshold for a tax-exempt household.

How to apply: You must apply to receive this benefit. Call the following number to receive an application form, then complete and mail the application. *Must be postmarked by January 31, 2023.

Emergency Benefit for Newborn Parents

Families with new children need to spend large sums of money at one time for childbirth and care afterward. Amid soaring costs, we will provide 50,000 yen per newborn to households where a child was born this fiscal year.

Eligibility: Household with an address in Kobe that is raising a child who was born between April 1, 2022 - March 31, 2023

Procedures: In principle, payment is made to the child allowance account (including special benefits).

Civil servants, foster parents, and those who are not eligible for child allowance (including special benefits) must apply online (via e-KOBE).



Watch Out for **Double Epidemics**

There is a possibility of simultaneous epidemics of COVID-19 and influenza, so please get vaccinated as soon as possible. Both vaccines can be administered at the same time. In case you develop a fever and are unable to visit a fever clinic immediately, be sure to prepare a COVID-19 test kit, fever medicine, food, and other daily necessities for convalescing at home.

Free test kits for junior & senior high school students

Period: December 9 - 18


Locations: Higashi Yuenchi Park, Kobe Asahi Bldg., open space in front of SMBC HQ, Chinatown
