Do you need that ambulance? 4 consultation services to call



To ensure that ambulances can reach the people who need them as soon as possible, it is important for everyone to call the consultation service appropriate to their situation.

🖀 #7119: Emergency Advice Hotline

Available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year

If you or someone you live with has a fever that isn't going down, suddenly has a stomachache, gets injured in the middle of the night, etc.

Make a selection with the automated voice guidance.

• Emergency phone consultation: A nurse will assess the state of the illness or injury, determine the urgency, and guide you to a hospital or clinic or connect you to an ambulance.

• Medical institution guidance: The operator will guide you to an available hospital or clinic.

(Weekdays) 8 pm - 7 am, (Saturdays) 3 pm - 7 am, (Sundays/Holidays/New Year Holidays) 9 am - 7 am

If your child is weak from a high fever in the middle of the night, suddenly stops drinking milk, is constantly vomiting or has continuous convulsions, etc.

Available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year

If you need to go to the hospital but don't feel you can do it by yourself, have difficulty traveling by wheelchair, etc.

* Transport services require a fee

If an elderly person does not need to go to the hospital but wants to discuss their health concerns, or their family is concerned about their health and wants advice, etc.

If you think someone might have heatstroke

There are often many cases of heatstroke in July. If symptoms become severe, it can be life-threatening.

What to do

① Is the person showing signs of heatstroke? (Dizziness, lightheadedness, profuse sweating, headache, nausea, fatigue, impaired consciousness, convulsions, high temperature) Yes ↓

2 Do they respond when you talk to them?

Yes \rightarrow Move them to a cool place, loosen their clothing, and cool their body

No \rightarrow Call an ambulance (**\mathbb{Z}**119). Administer first aid until the ambulance arrives. If they do not respond well, do not force them to drink water.

③ Can they take fluids on their own?

Yes→ Replenish their fluids and salts. If they have been sweating profusely, make sure they drink something that contains salt.

 $No \rightarrow$ Take them to a hospital or clinic. Make sure the person who accompanies them knows what happened when the person collapsed, and tells the staff about their condition when the symptoms started.

④ Have the symptoms improved?

Yes \rightarrow Allow the person to rest thoroughly where they are. If they are outside, take them home after they have recovered.

No \rightarrow Take them to a hospital or clinic.

Medical Expense Subsidy for high school students starts in October!

Regardless of their family's income, all high school students can go to the hospital for illness or injury with a decreased co-pay.

	Outpatient visit	Inpatient visit
0 - 2 y.o.	Free	
3 y.o high school age	Per hospital/clinic/pharmacy: Up to 400 yen/day on 1st & 2nd visits Free from 3rd visit onward	Free

Eligibility: All residents of Kobe aged 18 or under, until March 31 following their 18th birthday. (Does not have to be attending high school)

How to receive the subsidy: In principle, no application is needed. A new recipient certificate will be mailed out in late September. Those who need to apply will receive a notice from Kobe City, so please apply then.
